

Suggested Data Privacy Rights Statement for Council Online Privacy Notice

The GSUSA Data Privacy team has created the following template based on GSUSA's data privacy rights section of our online Privacy Notice. Councils may use this as a guide to update the privacy rights section of their online privacy notice. The template below is suggested by the GSUSA Data Privacy team and should not be construed as legal advice. Councils should review this with their legal counsel to tailor this information for the states where your council has customers and obtain approval.

State-Specific Data Privacy Information

Girl Scouts of Nassau County serves customers in New York. Regardless of your state of residency, Girl Scouts of Nassau County and Girl Scouts of the USA honor the following rights with respect to Personal Data collected from you when you visit our Sites:

- **Confirm** whether GSUSA is processing your Personal Data and, if so, **access** that Personal Data.
- **Rectify/correct** any inaccuracies in your Personal Data.
- Ask us to **delete** any of your Personal Data that is stored in our systems.
- **Obtain a copy** of the Personal Data we have for you in a format that allows you to transmit it to another data controller (also known as the "Right to Data Portability").

You have the right to be free from unlawful discrimination to exercise your rights.

While we are not currently subject to the data protection laws that provide rights to residents of other U.S. states, we continue to monitor the privacy law landscape and, when necessary, will update our practices and this Notice to remain in compliance with applicable laws.

Exercising Your Rights

Only you or an adult you designate to act on your behalf (where permitted by law) may make a request related to your Personal Data. A request to exercise any of these rights must identify the right you want to exercise and describe the information to which your request relates in sufficient detail to allow us to understand, evaluate, and respond to your request.

You may also have a right to appeal a decision we make relating to requests to exercise these rights. To appeal a decision, please follow the instructions we provide in our communication to you regarding the status of your request.
